MATHEMATICS (10 min daily)

Week 1: Days of the week and months of the year: Write out the days of the week and the months of the year. What is today? What was yesterday? What will tomorrow be? What is the month we are in? what number month is it. Practice the days of the week song and the months of the year song. Become familiar with spelling the days of the week and the months of the year through practice each day.

Week 3: Simple Addition to ten: Complete the following equations using objects around the house $(3+1=_, 10=5+_, 9=_+3, 8=8+_, 7=3+_, 6+3=_, 9+0=_, 6+1=_, 10=6+_, 5+2=_)$. Make up a number story about each of the equations that you have written in your book. All equations should be written fully into your book.

Week 4: Simple Subtraction within ten: Complete the following equations using objects around the house $(3 - 1 = _, 10 = 15 - _, 7 = _ - 3, 8 = 8 - _, 7 = 9 - _, 6 - 3 = _, 9 - 0 = _, 6 - 1 = _, 3 = 9 - _, 5 - 2 = _)$. Make up a number story about each of the equations that you have written in your book. All equations should be written fully into your book.

Week 5: 3D shapes (vertex, edge, face, surface): Look around the house and identify objects that are various 3D shapes (cube, cone, sphere, cylinder, pyramid, prism). Make a list of the objects you have found and what 3D shape it looks like.

On one of the shapes that you have found, draw it and label a vertex, edge, and face or surface.

Week 6: Numbers within 20: Identify patterns of doubles and halves to the number 20. Write these as sentences e.g Half of ten is five, double five is equal to ten. Practice the doubles to twenty song each day
