Establish a Change4Life club	Change4Life is a government health initiative aimed at increasing physical activity levels in less active 7-9 year-olds through multi-game ideas. The club was trialled as an after school club last year, and this year is being taken over by Y5 pupils as a lunch time club. Change4Life clubs are proven to have a significant impact on vulnerable groups within the school and act as a vehicle for developing a sense of belonging, confidence and competence that will ultimately set children up in leading active and healthy lifestyles.	Cost is part of the HTSA budget – as they provide the kit bag and training.	The club has been set up, pupils identified as in need of further exercise in Y3 and 4 have been targeted through questionnaires. The two Sports Ambassadors have had training and receive support meeting with PE co-ordinator to deliver the club on Tuesday lunchtimes.
External Sports Coaches working in school.	Expert coaches working across the key stages to enhance the provision for the pupils and at the same time providing a hands-on learning experience for teaching staff.
